



PE Sport Premium 2016/2017

Review - April 2017

The Sport Premium received by Forty Hill C of E Primary School in 2016/17 is £9035. Below is the suggested allocation of funds and the intended impact that this funding will have for the school.

Actual impact

Miss Burling inspires and motivates the children that she teaches with highly engaging and active PE lessons. The children have benefited from her experience and enjoy the PE lessons. Miss Burling teaches from the Get Set for Sport Curriculum, which she tailors to fit the needs of our school and she is always accommodating when we have focus weeks or particular requirements. She is currently teaching Years 2, 3, 4 and 5 with the class teacher delivering the second session. She also provides summative reports which form part of the child's school report for the end of the academic year. Our class teachers are able to observe the coaching skills of the experts and engage with their own classes in future PE lessons.

Actual impact

Year 6 (September to February) had swimming lessons at Albany Pool, every Tuesday during term time. This helped with their core strength and development of essential swimming skills. The majority of the children can now swim at least 25m by the end of their sessions. Swimming develops the children's muscles and lung capacity, but also contributes to the development of their personal organisational skills. During the Summer term, Year 6 will undertake school journey where they will be taking part in water based activities. Whilst the children will have the appropriate buoyancy aids, it is important for the teachers to know that they are confident in the water. Whilst the sport premium has not been spent on the actual swimming lessons – as this is part of the curriculum – we use the sport premium to pay for the cost of the transport to and from Albany Pool and the additional adults employed to ensure our children can travel and participate in the swimming programme safely.

Actual Impact

Our Positive Behaviour Policy encourages children to communicate their feelings and our school values discuss behaviours both in and outside of the classroom. The children have been given freedom to play with more balls and equipment in the playground and field and have been taught fair-play and how to use the equipment, resulting in fewer disputes. New goals have been purchased as well as cricket equipment and a number of different balls and playground toys. This has resulted in happier playtimes and less incidents in the behaviour log. Outside activities and outdoor playground equipment boost imagination, motor and problem solving skills, language development, help in overcoming mental and physical challenges, etc. It is important to encourage the physical and mental development of our children with fun, colourful, durable and safe outdoor playground equipment.

Actual Impact

We have been fortunate enough to have two generous donations to fund new football kits and so the £600 allocated for the kit has not been needed and reallocated.

We have spent £100 to add to the existing netball kit. The children representing our school during sports matches feel a sense of pride when wearing the kit. We encourage all children to participate in sport and our gifted and talented children – many of whom see sport as their main interest and vital for their wellbeing – are able to represent our school in a number of tournaments and matches.

Actual Impact

Due to a number of staff changes, it was agreed that the hiring of a stadium for sports day in 2017 would not take place. We will investigate the possibility of this in 2018.

Children to be rewarded with football sessions for good behaviour and concentration in the lead up to, and after, SATs tests.

Children to benefit from team values and understand the importance of fair play.

Actual Impact

Pro Direct Football Academy http://prodirectacademy.com/ hold a thirty minute lunchtime session during the summer term 2017 for pairs of classes (Rec & Year 1, Year 2 & Year 3, Year 4 & Year 5, Year 6). The sessions have so far proved successful with all sessions full and participants from every class – both boys and girls. The exercise is good for the children and the skills taught – including fair play – have benefited the children in future games on the field. Teachers ask specific children who perhaps require some extra exercise and also use the sessions as a reward for good behaviour.

Use a Sports Company to hold intra-sport competitions for all children to participate in a range of sports as well as provide medals and trophies to celebrate sporting success.


Actual Impact

Get Set for Sport http://www.getset4sport.co.uk/ have been booked to hold a Wimbledon Event for the whole school on Thursday 13th July. This will involve all children participating in a competitive tennis tournament, complementing the skills that they will be learning in their PE lessons and putting these skills to good use in a competition. The medals and trophies provided will instil a sense of pride amongst the children as well as giving children something to aim for when playing competitive sport.





In addition to this event, part of this allocation is spent on the hiring of a minibus to transport children to and from competitions and events. This way, we can ensure that all players selected can represent the school rather than only those who are able to organise transport. Our football team successfully won the Enfield Borough Tournament and then represented Enfield in the London Youth Games — a minibus was used to transport us to the tournament in Crystal Palace as well as a number of tournaments throughout the season.

Actual Impact

Forty Hill offers a wide range of lunchtime and after school 'physical' opportunities. These are open to any pupil in the relevant year group. This includes teams, groups and competitions. Additional opportunities in a range of competitive activities are provided by the Enfield PE team in the form of tournaments and events against other schools. The school works closely with the Borough PE team to maximise all opportunities for participation in sport. Forty Hill has taken part in various competitions including: netball matches, football matches, tag rugby, hockey, athletics, cricket and a dance festival. Enfield PE service also provides high quality training course for staff and are always on hand to advise the PE subject leader and staff with the curriculum and provision.
