<b>Literacy and Communication</b> (Speaking and Listening, language and communication)	Write a poem on the theme of war. Think about the different poems that we have looked at during Literacy lessons to inspire you.	Look on the website <a href="http://www.pobble365.com">www.pobble365.com</a> . Choose an image to write a short creative story from. You may wish to use the story starter provided underneath the picture.	Teach your parents some of the new French vocabulary that you have learnt this term and see if you can have a short conversation with them
<b>Science and Outside Environment</b> (Science, PE, Healthy Lifestyles, Eco issues and investigation)	Choose 2 animals and create a table to show as many as possible similarities and differences between them.	Create an informative poster that illustrates the life cycle of a butterfly.	Go into your garden (or take a walk in the park) and complete a survey of the different organisms that you find.
<b>RE</b>	Write and beautifully present a prayer that could be added to our class prayer book. You may choose from one of the following themes: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>remembrance</li> <li>Christmas</li> </ul>	Remembrance Day - create a piece of art work depicting poppies or a poppy field.	Design a poster which advertises the true meaning of Christmas.  (Try to use images / words which reinforce the Christian story and message, and why we celebrate this special time of the year in the Christian religion.)
<b>Humanities and Citizenship</b> (History, Geography, Moral & Social and Economic Awareness)	Make your own artefact from World War 2 - this could be a rationing book, an evacuation case, a gas mask, soldier's helmet or a medal.	Research and design your own World War 2 propaganda poster	Create a presentation about what you would pack if you were evacuated to another place today, giving your reasons for each item.
<b>Creative Arts</b> (Art, Design and Technology, Music, Drama and Dance)	Make a drawing, painting or collage using different materials that shows a scene from World War 2.	Research and make a WW2 recipe to share with your family, friends or class.	Imagine that you are a soldier at war. Choreograph a dance that represent the experiences that you would go through. You could record this or perform it to me in school.

At Forty Hill we believe in developing the whole child, academically as well as spiritually, morally, socially and culturally. We understand that some parents like lots of homework whereas others wish for none at all. In order to find a 'best fit', we publish our homework grids on a half termly basis, giving a range of activities for children to do, both independently or with adult support. **One** homework activity needs to be completed each week and handed in **every Wednesday morning**. This will be acknowledged by the teaching team. Remember to choose at **least 1 activity from each row over the half term**. Remember to be as **creative** as possible!
