

Forty Hill CE School PE Sport Premium 2020-2021



From September 2017, the Government announced that they would be doubling the Sport Premium for schools. The Sport Premium received by Forty Hill C.E. School for 2020-21 is **£17,780**. Below is the suggested allocation of funds and the intended impact that this funding will have for the school.

Schools must use the funding to make **additional and sustainable** improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer including:

- developing or adding to the PE and sport activities that the school already offers
- building capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in future years

Due to the Covid Pandemic from March 2020, some of the 2019-2020 funding was not spent on the allocated improvements. Appointing a Sports Coach company to work alongside staff and children throughout the school will raise the profile of PE during school time, after school (when possible to reintroduce clubs following the Covid Pandemic) and at break and lunchtimes. Lunchtimes will enable the children to benefit from team values and understand the importance of fair play, whilst PE sessions will be enhanced by the presence of a Sports Coach supporting the teaching and learning. The children have benefited from their experience and enjoy the PE lessons. Mr Douglas, Mr Ford, Mr Jenkins and Mr Slade have taught from the Enfield PE Curriculum, which they tailor to fit the needs of our school. They are always accommodating when we have focus weeks or particular requirements. Currently Years 1-4 benefit from their teaching, with the class teacher delivering the second session of the week.</i>	
Replenishing and adding equipment to the outdoor playtime equipment as well as PE equipment will enable a greater range of activities to take place and encourage children to be more responsible for the equipment purchased for them. At this point, he will be moving on to University. Lucy Turner from Four Seasons Forest School delivers sessions to every child in the school across the academic year (taking place on Tuesday afternoons). This continued during the pandemic for key worker children. The children have worked with the resources available in our field and meadow, lit fires and used their imagination outdoors to help influence their articulation and writing skills. Benefits are numerous, including improving mental health and wellbeing, spending time outdoors and learning about nature and the benefits it has on our bodies and health.</i>

Hiring of a minibus/taxi allows all children to access the sporting events and not always rely on parents helping to organise lifts.
