

## Forty Hill CE School PE Sport Premium 2020-2021



From September 2017, the Government announced that they would be doubling the Sport Premium for schools. The Sport Premium received by Forty Hill C.E. School for 2020-21 is **£17,780**. Below is the suggested allocation of funds and the intended impact that this funding will have for the school.

Schools must use the funding to make **additional and sustainable** improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer including:

- developing or adding to the PE and sport activities that the school already offers
- building capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in future years

Due to the Covid Pandemic from March 2020, some of the 2019-2020 funding was not spent on the allocated improvements.
