Impact

Nursery – Buying poppies from the nurseries (November 2018)

On Monday in **Nursery** the children spoke about Remembrance and the importance of purchasing a poppy. The class

then visited the Clockhouse Plant Nursery to buy one each. Whilst they were there, the children looked at various plants and as well as the poppy, some flowers were purchased for our raised garden bed. The children then came back to nursery and made their own poppies by printing them, using various vegetables.







Reception – Stay and Play with Nairn House OAPs (May 2019)

As part of our 'Reaching Out' program, class **Reception** had a stay and play at Nairn House, a local Residential Care Home. The children had such a lovely time meeting the residents and took them pictures they had drawn of their families as well as singing them some of their favourite songs. The children and residents had a chance to get to know each other by sharing their experiences. They met a lovely lady that had recently turned 100 years old! Amazing! The children also met a resident that actually came to Forty Hill School a long time ago. Year 1 – Crocus planting with the Rotary Club (November 2018)

Year 4 - Harvest donations delivery to North Enfield Food Bank (October 2018)

As part of our outreach programme, **Year 4** visited the North Enfield Foodbank to deliver all of the generous Harvest service donations. They went to the church on Tuesday morning and worked as a team to carefully load up all the food and toiletries the school had brought into the van ready for the afternoon trip. After lunch, the class walked to the bus stop and aboard the 217, travelling down to the foodbank. It took plenty of muscle and more teamwork to unpack, weigh and sort the donations. Whilst they were there they also had a talk from the foodbank manager about the wonderful work they do and how helpful our donations would be.
