Curriculum Area	Learning Opportunities		
Literacy and Communication (Speaking and Listening, language and communication)	Write an adventure story of a child during World War 2. This could be set in London, during the blitz or could be about a child who is evacuated..	Write a poem on the theme of war. Think about the different poems that we have looked at during Literacy lessons to inspire you.	Look on the website www.pobble365.com . Choose an image to write a short creative story from. You may wish to use the story starter provided underneath the picture.!
Science and Outside Environment (Science, PE, Healthy Lifestyles, Eco issues and investigation)	Either draw and label a 2D picture or make a 3D model of the heart.	Write a story from the perspective of an oxygen molecule and its journey as it travels through the circulatory system.	Practise a new way of exercising for 5 minutes each day for a week.
RE	Write and beautifully present a prayer that could be added to our class prayer book. You may choose from one of the following themes: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> remembrance Christmas 	Remembrance Day - create a piece of art work depicting poppies or a poppy field.	Design a poster which advertises the true meaning of Christmas. (Try to use images / words which reinforce the Christian story and message, and why we celebrate this special time of the year in the Christian religion.)
Humanities and Citizenship (History, Geography, Moral & Social and Economic Awareness)	Make your own artefact from World War 2 - this could be a rationing book, an evacuation case, a gas mask, soldier's helmet or a medal.	Research and design your own World War 2 propaganda poster	Create a presentation about what you would pack if you were evacuated to another place today, giving your reasons for each item.
Creative Arts (Art, Design and Technology, Music, Drama and Dance)	Make a drawing, painting or collage using different materials that shows a scene from World War 2.	Research and make a WW2 recipe to share with your family, friends or class.	Imagine that you are a soldier at war. Choreograph a dance that represent the experiences that you would go through. You could record this or perform it to me in school.

At Forty Hill we believe in developing the whole child, academically as well as spiritually, morally, socially and culturally. We understand that some parents like lots of homework whereas others wish for none at all. In order to find a 'best fit', we publish our homework grids on a half termly basis, giving a range of activities for children to do, both independently or with adult support. **One** homework activity needs to be completed each week and handed in **every Wednesday morning**.
