It's been an action-packed month in our Nursery, filled with learning, growth, and lots of fun! From planting beans to role play in our construction area, our little learners have embarked on numerous adventures. Here's a glimpse into the amazing moments we've shared:

Inspired by the enchanting story of "Jasper's Beanstalk," our nursery children have started their green-

fingered journey this half term. All the children were encouraged to plant a broad bean, mirroring Jasper's curiosity and hope. Watching their



beans sprout has been a daily excitement, sparking conversations about nature, patience, and care. The excitement doubled when we moved our little sprouts to our brand-new greenhouse! This transition from our mini greenhouses (the sandwich bags on the windows) to pots was a handson lesson about the natural world, nurturing our young gardeners to



become global neighbours. We are so proud of their personal, social, and emotional development. Amidst our gardening adventures, we've been building on our phonics knowledge, diving into the sounds letters make and how they blend to form words. Through games, songs, and playful activities, our nursery children are becoming very confident in orally blending words, turning sounds into words and smiles. I'm

sure you're hearing all about our sound of the week! Lastly, our construction area and beloved mud kitchen have transformed into realms of endless possibility, where our young learners are not just playing but creating worlds of their own. In the construction area, blocks and materials become walls, bridges, and fantastical fortresses, fostering an environment where creativity knows no bounds. Meanwhile, the mud kitchen has served as a culinary studio for the most imaginative chefs; mud pies and leafy concoctions are the specials of the day, accompanied by lots of laughter.

Such a lot seems to have happened since our last Newsletter and we hope that this entry finds you filled with the joy of spring, just as we are. It's been wonderful to be outside more often. We have been busy using our text Rosie's Walk to create and label maps and to write a narrative for the untold story of Fox's adventures. We have explored vocabulary through artistic

means by making windmills with paper fasteners and developing our observational drawing skills. There was a reall 'buzz' in the room when the children used oil pastels and explored the different ways they can be used. The children are all developing as readers and writers in our daily phonics and reading sessions and they seem particularly proud of being able to take their books home. Even more delightful has been them beginning to read posters and information around the school as they recognise tricky words and digraphs.... it's the little things! The children have developed their number bond knowledge and skills this half term and enjoyed the practical tasks of comparing length and height. We have been developing our understanding of 3d shapes in the

environment and used them to explore repeated patterns. The children have begun to attend more Acts of Worship and are regular attenders of Singing Assembly - can't think why! We have been preparing for Easter with Bible stories and songs and the children have been particularly reflective each week, building

their familiarity with the events, and vocabulary, of Holy Week. We enjoyed a



special visit from Rev Mandy to explore the core concept of God to create some art for our whole school Big Story of the Bible timeline and it was lovely to involve so many people. We're incredibly proud of the progress and enthusiasm our reception class has shown. Thank you for your continued support, have a





#### Year 1 - Mrs Kubilay, Ms Bowery and Mrs Golebiowska

It has been such a busy yet exciting time with all of our learning in Year One these last few weeks! In Literacy, after finishing off our fantastic narratives based on the story Lin Yi's |Lantern, we moved onto a new story "Little Red' which is a twist on the well-known fairy tale, Little Red Riding Hood. The children got to know the new story by acting out important scenes and ordering the story in images. They then turned in investigative journalists and wrote their very own newspaper articles which have been so exciting to read. In maths, we have focused on measuring and have started to use rulers to measure in cm, the

children have enjoyed exploring and measuring a range of objects around the classroom and using the correct mathematical vocabulary. We have continued with



our Easter story in RE and have focused on each part of Holy week, thinking about what it teaches us about Jesus. The children created their own Easter gardens in pairs which all looked fabulous. The children carefully thought about the details, drawing on their knowledge of what happened on Easter Sunday.



#### Year 2 - Miss Wisbey, Miss Petris and Ms Darby

It has been a wonderful and busy half term in Year 2! The children have really loved their new geography topic - comparing the UK to the Caribbean island of St Lucia. They have considered the similarities and differences between the two islands, thinking about their human and physical features. Based on their topic of this half term, the children were

inspired to write their very own setting descriptions of the Caribbean, using their focus book of Gregory Cool as a stimuli. Within Maths, class 2 have been exploring the area of "measuring". The children have demonstrated lots of enthusiasm while practically measuring mass, volume, temperature and lengths. As Easter approaches, Year 2 have been learning about the meaning of Easter for Christians. They have been focusing on a range of Easter symbols and have discovered their significance within the Easter story. Well Done Year 2 for working so hard this term!



#### Year 3 — Miss Hills and Ms Bishop

This half term has been absolutely jam-packed in Year 3 with so much lovely learning and exciting experiences! The class have thoroughly enjoyed their Forest School sessions, despite the muddy conditions! The children took part in lots of games and team building activities and really shone in this new environment. Miss Hills and Ms Bishop were blown away by the children's behaviour and enthusiasm on their recent trip to the National Gallery and the children were so excited to see





some of the paintings
they had learnt about
right in front of them! They
were without a doubt a credit
to our school and we can see
lots of budding artists,
curators and art historians in
the making! Back in the
classroom, the children have
been wrapping up their RE unit:
Who is the most important





person in the Easter Story? After learning about the stories of Judas, Peter and Mary Magdalene, they considered what a believer could learn from each person and how it may affect their lives. The children were incredibly thoughtful and articulate and showed a great understanding of the core concept of Salvation. Well done Year 3 on another fantastic half term!



#### **Year 4 - Miss Campion and Ms** Cox

What a lovely few weeks we have had in Year 4. As part of their Science unit 'Living Things and Their Habitats', the children planned and carried out an investigation to explore whether litter was having a negative impact on our local area. After going on a litter pick, we created a frequency table as a class and each child

created their own bar chart to present their data. They then wrote scientific conclusions to discuss the impact of littering and what could be done to reduce this. Later in the term, as part of our Art Day, the children explored the work of Brazilian artist, Genaro de Carvalho, which linked to our Topic unit, 'The UK and Brazil'. The children created their own relief prints. They created sketches of plants and flowers and then created their own designs on polystyrene printing plates. They then used ink and rollers to print their designs in their books. They created some wonderful collages of art in their books. Finally, in Literacy, the

children learnt about the deforestation occurring in the Amazon Rainforest and the effects on the Yanomami tribe. The children successfully wrote newspaper articles using journalistic phrases, quotes from experts and were able to inform their reader about the devastating impact of deforestation on the Yanomami Tribe. Well done Year 4, it's been a great half term!

#### Year 5 - Mr Kansara and Mrs Buller


What an incredible term it's been for us here in Year 5! We've been fully

Year 6 really enjoyed studying bible passages and discussing them in order to develop their understanding. In art, the children looked at South African Shweshwe fabric designs to inspire their own patterns which they printed onto cotton using glue batik. ## Understanding our Brains...

So we have already, in our January newsletter, learned about the amygdala and how it is responsible for our emotions and how, if we try to calm our instant reactions then we can respond to situations more reasonably but why is that?

If we solely rely on the amygdala, we trigger our flight, fight or freeze responses in our brains because it has classified something as a threat. However, if we can pause, even briefly, it allows another part of our brain, the prefrontal

cortex, to really think carefully about the information and instead of an instant reaction, we can choose a response more carefully instead. Mindful thinking happens when the prefrontal cortex can process the information. Following your breath or counting to ten when you're angry or sad gives time for the amygdala to allow the information to flow to the prefrontal cortex to be properly analyzed. Controlled breathing can override the fight, flight, or freeze response set off




by the amygdala, and instead enable mindful behaviour and time to choose more carefully. I always try to remember to breath — silly really as it's what I have done since the day I was born - but what I really mean is to think about breathing, notice it and pay it attention. Pausing at the top of the in breath for a few seconds then breathing out is a great way to bring focus to your breath and time for you to engage your prefrontal cortex.

What good news about God and his love for the world could you share with others today?






