<b>Weekly Homework</b>	<b>Reading</b> - Children should be reading every day, ideally reading out loud with an adult.	<b>Spelling</b> - Continue to revise words and spelling patterns that the children have worked on in class. <i>All spelling lists can be found on our website in the class pages</i>	<b>Maths</b> - Continue to practise your times tables. How quickly can you recall the facts in a <b>random order</b> ? <i>Additional Maths Homework can be found on our website in the class pages.</i>
<b>Curriculum Area</b>	<b>Learning Opportunities</b>		
<b>Literacy and Communication</b> (Speaking and Listening, language and communication)	Write a story about how you found a Roman soldier in your garden. What did you do with him? How did he get there?	The value for this half term is friendship. Create a page that shows this value in any way you wish.	Write a Roman inspired poem or rap.
<b>Science and Outside Environment</b> (Science, PE, Healthy Lifestyles, Eco issues and investigation)	Design a poster about what you would need to do/be aware of in Roman times. dangerous foods, volcanoes, etc...	Create a piece of work that shows Roman people's diet. Make a comparison between what was eaten then and what we eat today. What is different? What is similar?	Go to Forty Hall or another outdoor space and see what types of soil or rocks you can find.
<b>RE</b>	Find out how many books are in the Old and New Testament. Make a list of some of them in two different columns (Old Testament and New Testament).	Write a lunchtime prayer that we can use in class. Make sure you illustrate it beautifully as it could be placed on our prayer wall.	Read a story from either the Old or New Testament and make a story board showing the main events. Make sure you write down the name of the story and where it is from.
<b>Humanities and Citizenship</b> (History, Geography, Moral & Social and Economic Awareness)	What was Hadrian's Wall? Carry out some research and create a poster showing what you have found out.	Use a map of the world to show where some of the biggest civilisations have been throughout history.	Create a fact file about the Roman Baths in Bath.
<b>Creative Arts</b> (Art, Design and Technology, Music, Drama and Dance)	Use cardboard (this could be a cereal box) to create your own Roman shield.	Using any medium you like, create your own Roman mosaic. Make the design as detailed as possible.	Use some old sheets or pillow cases and create your own fashionable toga. Take some pictures of you wearing your creation!

At Forty Hill we believe in developing the whole child, academically as well as spiritually, morally, socially and culturally. We understand that some parents like lots of homework whereas others wish for none at all. In order to find a 'best fit', we publish our homework grids on a half termly basis, giving a range of activities for children to do, both independently or with adult support. **One** homework activity needs to be completed each week and handed in **every Wednesday morning**.
