Families joined us for our two sessions- Phase 1 am and Phase 2 pm. • Sports clubs were available throughout the school year- football, netball, multi-sports, dance, and ballet. • Our school teams took part in football, netball, cross country, gymnastics, athletics and tag rugby competitions. • Our dance group took part in the Enfield Dance Festival. • Year 3 attended the Park Event for Enfield schools. • Happier and more focused playtimes due to introduction of new play and sports equipment. • Even though there was a change in Coaching Companies in the Autumn Term- we now have consistent and high-quality provision from Elms Sports in our PE lessons and Afterschool Sports Clubs. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Assessment of PE by our Sports Coaches and Teachers now we have a permanent and high-quality company (Elms) in place. • Participation and success in a range of inter and intra-school sports competitions led by our PE Lead Mr Kansara. • To continue the engagement of staff / parents to ensure that fixtures and competitions run smoothly throughout the academic year. • To continue to develop more purposeful and structured play at break times to ensure children are engaged and stimulated positively, and demonstrating our school Values specifically when playing competitive sport (from the School Development Plan 24-25 and 25-26) • To continue to build a regular and impactful relationship with the new Education team at Tottenham. • To provide more opportunities for preparation and skills development of specific sports prior to events and competitions. • To establish and develop a girls football team.
