Guidance for Forty Hill School Uniform



We are proud of our school uniform. We believe our uniform makes a positive statement about the high expectations of our school, gives children a sense of pride in their shared school community and supports both staff and parents to fulfil our commitment to equality. We will work closely with parents to maintain our high standards and support our pupils to be proud of wearing their uniform.

Ordering and Purchasing Uniform

Our uniform can be purchased at J Smith & Sons (Baker Street) or on line by logging into <https://www.smithsschoolwear.co.uk/>

Enter "Forty Hill" in the search section and the uniform will appear.

You can also purchase general uniform items (those without our logo) from other suppliers e.g. Marks & Spencer and major supermarkets.

Where a family might face problems in providing correct uniform, or in any temporary circumstance where an incorrect uniform is likely, we request that parents contact the school in order that we might understand and offer support. Uniform will be checked regularly and if the school is aware of any problems it can save children being questioned unnecessarily.

- Dark grey trousers or bottle green tunic/skirt - White shirt with collar and Forty Hill tie (KS1 children may wear a polo shirt (school logo is optional and no tie) - Bottle green V-neck jumper, sweatshirt or cardigan with school logo. - Optional bottle green fleece with school badge for winter months. - Black, grey or dark green socks or tights	- Dark grey shorts - Green and white Gingham dress with white/black socks - All children have the option of wearing a white polo shirt (school logo is optional). If they continue to wear a white shirt they must also wear their tie.

Nursery School Uniform	Summer Uniform (optional for Summer term)
- Black jogging bottoms or black leggings - White polo shirt (school logo is optional) - Bottle green sweatshirt with school badge - Black socks or black tights	- Black shorts and white polo shirt (school logo is optional) - Green and white Gingham dress with white/black socks

P.E. Kit

PE Kit is recognised as an important part of the school uniform and children must wear their PE kit into school on their allocated PE days and for specific events such as Sports Day. For health and safety reasons, children will be required to remove their jewellery or cover stud earrings with tape.

The school can not be held responsible for loss or damage to jewellery.

Black Plimsolls and/or trainers

You may wish your child to have a green sweatshirt (with school badge) for PE

Nursery children do not require a PE kit

Labelling

CLOTHING MUST BE CLEARLY MARKED WITH CHILD'S NAME including footwear and bags.

Book Bags

All children from Nursery to Year 6 should have a Forty Hill school small backpack- both are available at Smiths, Baker Street. These can be used for their reading records, reading books and any letters that are sent out. As our school building is small with narrow corridors, we do not have space for rucksacks or personal bags.

Footwear

All black school shoes, short black books or all black trainers.

Footwear should be confined to shoes that support the foot and are comfortable; not a fashion statement, high heeled shoes or long boots. The children are encouraged at all times to ensure the shoes are correctly fixed on their feet. Younger children wearing shoes with laces must be able to tie their own laces, however for younger children, shoes with Velcro may better support their independence.

Jewellery

Only simple stud earrings and a simple watch (no smart watches) are allowed to be worn to school. Bracelets, necklaces or rings are not to be worn at any time. Children will be required to remove any items worn unless for religious reasons that have been notified to the Head of School in writing. The school will not be responsible for these items. Nail varnish or make-up is not allowed to be worn in school and will be removed if worn.

Hair

For safety reasons, long hair must be tied back with an appropriate fastening at all times (this applies to girls and boys). All fastenings or accessories need to be grey, black or green and should be small and indiscreet. Any closely cut haircuts should not have shapes or symbols shaved in, nor should hair be dyed including temporary or permanent coloured streaks.
